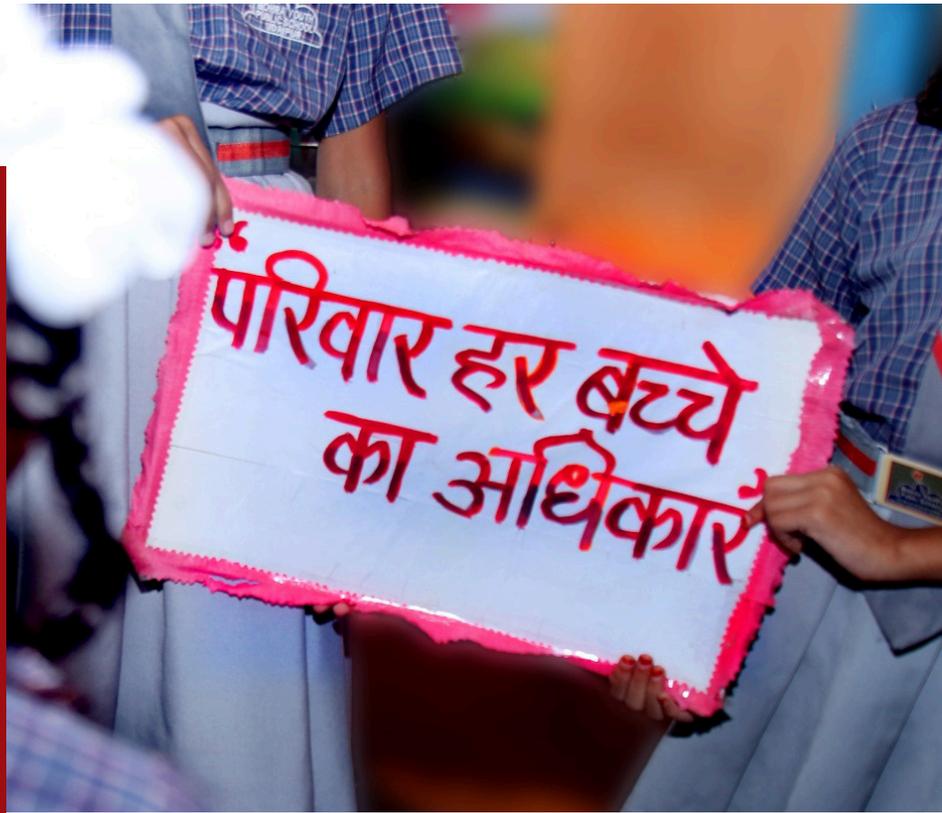

Recreational ACTIVITIES

Our recreational programming formed the cornerstone of our child development initiatives, with six carefully designed activities addressing various aspects of child growth and well-being.

1. Attention and Action

This foundational program focused on developing concentration skills and responsive behaviour patterns among children. Through structured activities and interactive sessions, participants enhanced their ability to focus, follow instructions, and take appropriate action in various situations.

2. Mother's Day Celebration

A special program honouring maternal figures and celebrating the importance of nurturing relationships. This activity helped children express gratitude, understand family values, and strengthen emotional bonds with their caregivers.





3. Building Social Skills, Emotional Intelligence and Self-Awareness

A comprehensive development program addressing three critical areas of child growth. Participants engaged in activities designed to improve interpersonal communication, emotional regulation, and self-understanding, laying the foundation for healthy relationships and personal development.

4. Deep Sajja & Garba Utsav

Cultural celebration activities that connected children with traditional heritage while promoting physical activity, cultural awareness, and community participation. These festivities fostered a sense of belonging and cultural identity.

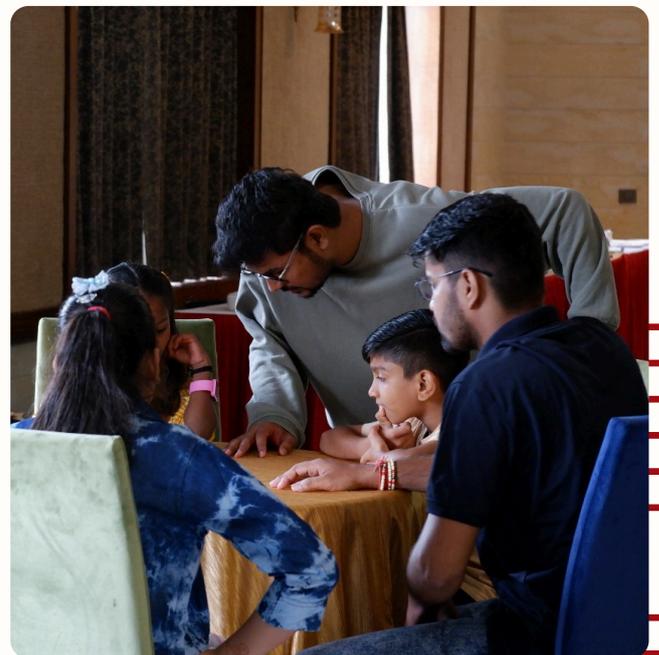


5. Assertiveness Training

Essential life skills training focused on teaching children how to express their needs, boundaries, and opinions in healthy, appropriate ways. This program equipped participants with tools for self-advocacy and confident communication.

6. Self-Defence Training

Practical safety training providing children with physical and mental tools for personal protection. This program enhanced confidence, physical fitness, and personal safety awareness while teaching conflict resolution strategies.





PROGRAM

Samvardhanam

Samvardhanam represents a vital bridge-building initiative spearheaded by the Foster Care Society, designed to strengthen the communication channels between foster families and government stakeholders. This innovative platform serves as a crucial forum where foster parents can directly voice their concerns, challenges, and recommendations to policy makers and government officials responsible for child welfare and foster care systems. By facilitating these direct dialogues, Samvardhanam addresses the often-overlooked gap between grassroots foster care experiences and institutional decision-making processes. The program recognizes that foster parents, being on the frontlines of childcare and protection, possess invaluable insights that can inform better policies, improve support systems, and enhance the overall foster care framework. Through regular interactions and structured discussions, Samvardhanam not only empowers foster families by giving them a voice in shaping the systems that affect them but also enables government stakeholders to make more informed, ground-reality-based decisions that ultimately benefit the children in foster care and the families who open their homes to them.

1. Family-Based Alternative Care in Rajasthan

A comprehensive program examining and promoting family-based care alternatives within the state of Rajasthan. This initiative involved stakeholder education, policy discussions, and practical implementation strategies for improving family-based care systems.

2. Psychosocial Behaviour of Children

An in-depth exploration of children's psychological and social behavioural patterns, providing caregivers and stakeholders with enhanced understanding and tools for supporting children's mental health and social development.

Capacity Building of stakeholder

MANTHAN represents a comprehensive stakeholder development initiative designed to strengthen the child protection ecosystem through strategic collaboration and knowledge enhancement. This intensive program serves as a dynamic convergence platform where child protection professionals, social workers, government officials, and community leaders unite to address systemic challenges and advance protective frameworks for vulnerable children. Through structured capacity building modules, participants engage in extensive knowledge sharing sessions, examine current protection gaps and emerging challenges, explore innovative intervention methodologies, and develop evidence-based strategies for enhanced service delivery. The program emphasizes critical areas including policy advocacy mechanisms, effective implementation frameworks, multi-stakeholder coordination protocols, and advanced case management practices, while fostering cross-sector partnerships essential for creating robust protection networks. By facilitating strategic planning workshops and best practice discussions, MANTHAN creates a collaborative learning environment that not only builds individual competencies but also strengthens institutional capacity, promotes policy coherence, and ultimately contributes to the development of more responsive, coordinated, and effective child protection systems that can adapt to evolving challenges and ensure comprehensive safeguarding of children's rights and wellbeing across communities.

Camping Program

1. Summer Camp

Our comprehensive summer program provided children with educational, recreational, and developmental activities during school holidays. The camp included outdoor activities, skill workshops, educational sessions, and social interaction opportunities.

2. Winter Camp

The winter camp focused on indoor activities, skill development, and educational enhancement during the colder months. Participants engaged in creative workshops, academic support, and character-building activities.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

Electrical and Home Appliances Training

The Electrical and Home Appliances Training program represents a transformative vocational initiative designed specifically for children residing in Child Care Institutions, addressing the critical gap between institutional care and independent living readiness. This comprehensive training curriculum begins with fundamental electrical safety protocols and core principles, ensuring participants develop a solid foundation in electrical theory before progressing to hands-on applications.



The program systematically builds technical competency through structured modules covering home appliance troubleshooting, where children learn to diagnose common issues with refrigerators, washing machines, air conditioners, and other household equipment. Participants master essential repair techniques and preventive maintenance practices while becoming proficient with specialized tools and adhering to stringent safety protocols throughout their learning journey.



The hands-on experiential component serves as the program's cornerstone, allowing children to work with actual appliances under expert supervision, translating theoretical knowledge into practical skills that directly translate to employability. Beyond technical training, this initiative serves as a powerful catalyst for personal development, systematically building self-reliance and confidence as participants witness their growing expertise in solving real-world problems. The program's ultimate objective extends far beyond skill acquisition, positioning these young individuals for economic empowerment by equipping them with marketable trade skills that can provide sustainable livelihoods, entrepreneurial opportunities, and the dignity of meaningful employment as they transition into independent adulthood, thereby breaking cycles of dependency and creating pathways to self-sufficiency.

AUDIT REPORT

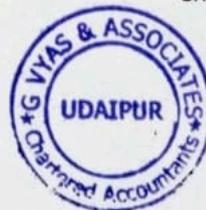

 - c. In case of the Receipts & Payment Account, of the receipts and payment of the organization for the period ended on that date.

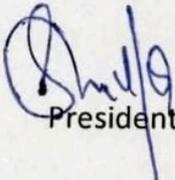
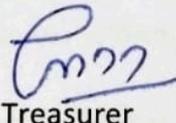
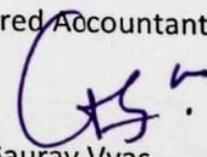
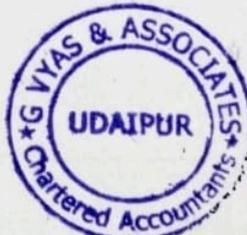
